

## Roman Civilization

### Objectius

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- To learn some specific content from the Social Science curriculum through English.
- To read, write and talk about Roman Civilization in English.
- To develop cognitive skills in a CLIL context.
- To engage students positively in a CLIL environment to benefit both from the learning of the content and the learning of the language.

### Descripció de la proposta

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This is a Social Science unit designed to be developed in 4th of ESO.  
This project is an approach to Roman Classical culture, in a CLIL context in English.

### Aspectes didàctics i metodològics

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This project is structured in three lessons:

- Monarchy and Republic (5 h),
- Empire and Romanization (5 h)
- Daily life and urban development (4 h).

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This didactic sequence contains downloadable worksheets addressed to students and ready to use materials and resources for teachers (ppt presentations, flashcards, games, videos, etc.).
